Our crops of sunflower and maize have been very successful and will be ready for harvest in April. Apprentices have really enjoyed their experience managing these crops and they have worked diligently to weed and constantly check their crops. Seeing such a fruitful yield has been incredibly encouraging for them and it has been commented that they are the best out grower producers for Heartlands!

We love hearing from our graduates and the production jobs they have gone into beyond Ebenezer. 2022 graduate, Jotham, is a trainee field officer working with broiler out growers.
