PRODUCTION

Each month, there are more than enough reasons to thank God for his faithfulness, even in our production. We started the month of May with a good cabbage harvest. It is pleasing to see the quality that is coming from our fields and the way our apprentices dedicate themselves to caring for the crops God entrusts to them. We continue to be grateful for our irrigation system and how it works!

Not only did we harvest cabbage this month, we transplanted cabbage seedlings too. The apprentices have continued to apply themselves to their work with dedication and we are seeing that we are able to follow our plan of having produce ready for harvest each month.

We are exploring options for other crops we can plant which will do well in the market. Possibilities include garlic, strawberry, peri-peri, pumpkin and butternut.

Our layer birds continue to impress us with their lay-rates. Our flock currently numbers 3,225 birds. They are 86 weeks old and hitting an average lay-rate of 83%.
