We continue to see apprentices playing a crucial role in our local churches, through their testimonies and the way they lead praise. They bring a vibrancy to the congregation that gets everyone involved - it is gratifying to see how children, young people and adults are all considered and involved in worship. And it is a blessing for us as an Ebenezer team to see apprentices grow and commit to God through their involvement in these churches.



This month saw us sell our 20th cycle of broiler birds and place our 21st cycle.

Our layer birds hit a pleasing lay-rate of 93% in February.



In February, we transplanted $\frac{1}{4}$ hectare of tomatoes, $\frac{1}{4}$ hectare of onions and we sowed $\frac{1}{5}$ hectare of tomatoes.

We also planted 1 hectare of butter beans and cabbage. All crops are being excellently cared for by apprentices with clear guidance from field coach, Fernando Alfredo. We thank God for Fernando and his open-minded approach to innovations.



Meet Zacarias Paqueleque, a second-year apprentice who recently expressed how grateful he is to be part of the Ebenezer family. He says that his relationship with the Lord is strengthened every day. At the same time he carries a feeling of deep sadness because the rest of his family are Muslims. He has spoken to them to warn them of the danger of not having Jesus as Lord and Saviour of their lives, but they do not believe and do not want to listen.
