Three months into our Foundation Course and we are seeing noticeable impacts in the lives of the apprentices that God has entrusted to us.

**Cognitive Impacts:** Apprentices have gained a clear understanding of who Jesus is as a saviour, of grace, unconditional love and his continued presence. They are beginning to interpret scripture in light of Jesus' role as saviour, and are learning how to apply scripture in everyday life.

**Emotional Impacts:** Apprentices are discovering emotional security as they understand how they are loved and accepted by Jesus, even when they fail. They are less anxious about spiritual performance, since salvation does not depend on perfection, but on grace.

**Spiritual Impacts:** We are beginning to see our apprentices develop a more personal and sincere prayer life, directed by the confidence of being saved by Jesus.

**Behavioural Impacts:** There is a shift in motivation for discipleship activities, from moral obligation to openness and a response to God of gratitude rather than duty.
