June was a month of preparation, transition and new energy at Ebenezer Kazungula. A great highlight of the month was welcoming 28 new apprentices: 10 young women and 18 young men who arrived with a lot of curiosity, enthusiasm and energy. Behind the scenes, staff had been working diligently to organise their orientation, prepare training materials and ensure a smooth start for all. Orientation activities helped our newcomers to settle in, understand the values that underpin Ebenezer and get excited for the journey ahead!



As we kick off this new year, Family Nights have been joyful gatherings with a tangible sense of togetherness, belonging and encouragement. A standout moment was inviting our first years into their first Family Night through a prayer tunnel of staff and second years, welcoming them into the Ebenezer Family and committing their time at Ebenezer to God.



We have enjoyed launching the Youth Alpha Course at our Family Nights. Watching young people explore faith with curiosity and open hearts is one of the great privileges of life at Ebenezer.

At the end of June, a group of apprentices, together with team leader Brilliant, visited New Life church in Katapazi. It was a great opportunity for our apprentices to serve and minister to a real church community, and an honour to lead the congregation in active praise and worship, before Brilliant shared an inspiring message.

PRODUCTION

This month we delivered 14,635 birds to the abattoir, becoming the abattoir's largest single supplier of birds at present.

In our broiler houses, our focus for June has been three-fold: help 2nd year apprentices take ownership of their businesses; ensure every apprentice understands the core production concepts; and equip each apprentice with broiler journals, SOPs and skills matrices.

We are excited to have installed a good ventilation system and sustainable lighting system in our broiler houses - this has improved bird growth and uniformity.

Renovation of our layer houses is currently underway and we look forward to placing 12,000 layer chicks in the next few weeks.

We were glad to achieve our cropping plan for June which was to harvest beans, shell maize and clear the fields in preparation for the new season.

Field preparation for early summer plantings are underway under our upgraded irrigation set-up. We are looking forward to starting with 1ha and increasing our cropping area as the year continues.
